English:

- Reading- Aim to read for 15 – 20 minutes daily. Here are some ideas for reading:
Borrowbox is a useful app to access lots of books. Audiobooks are also a really great way to explore different genres and can be accessed on *Audible*. Re-read your favourite novel and create your own dictionary of new or interesting words.
- Writing - The literacy shed – *The Lighthouse* <https://www.literacyshed.com/the-lighthouse.html>
 - Watch this short film and follow the directions for reading and discussion laid out.
 - Write a newspaper story of the event and include interviews with lighthousekeeper, villagers and men from the boat.
 - Write your own story where the problem was solved in a different way
